

IMPORT CONDITIONS DAY OLD TURKEYS, DUCKLINGS, GEESE AND OTHER POULTRY INTO KENYA

1. The birds come from establishments which are regularly inspected by the official veterinarian and from hatcheries which comply with the standards referred to in OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code,
2. The birds were kept in a Low Pathogenic Notifiable Avian Influenza (LPAI) and Highly Pathogenic Notifiable Avian Influenza (HPAI) free zone since they were hatched, AND were derived from parent flocks which had been kept in a Notifiable Avian Influenza free zone for at least 21 days prior to and at the time of the collection of the eggs,
3. The birds come from establishments free from avian mycoplasmosis;
4. The birds come from establishments and/or hatcheries which are recognized as being free from fowl typhoid and pullorum disease;
5. The birds were hatched and kept in an Newcastle Disease (ND) free country, zone or compartment,

AND, the birds were derived from parent flocks which had been kept in an ND free country, zone or compartment for at least 21 days prior to and at the time of the collection of the eggs,

AND, if the birds or parent flocks were vaccinated against ND, the nature of the vaccine used and the date of vaccination should also be attached to the certificate.

The following additional conditions shall be fulfilled during the importation:

6. The original copy of this import permit must accompany the birds along with the International Veterinary Certificate from the exporting country and presented to the Veterinary Officer at the port of entry.
7. The birds shall be shipped in clean and unused packages.
8. International Air Transport Association guidelines for safeguarding animal welfare during air travel shall be observed during the shipment.
9. This permit is valid for ninety days and is for one consignment only but may be cancelled any time by the Director of Veterinary Services.
