

IMPORT CONDITIONS FOR DOGS AND CATS INTO KENYA

No canine or feline animal shall be imported into Kenya from any country unless accompanied by an international veterinary certificate attesting that the animal:

1. Showed no clinical sign of rabies on the day of shipment;
2. Were kept since birth or for the 6 months prior to shipment in a rabies free country as defined in the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) Terrestrial Animal Health Code OR satisfy the following stipulations:
 - i. Showed no clinical sign of rabies within 48 hours of shipment;
AND EITHER
 - ii. Were identified by a permanent mark (such as a microchip) and their identification number shall be stated in the certificate or had any other adequate identification; and
 - iii. Were vaccinated against rabies:
 - a. Not less than 6 months and not more than one year prior to shipment in the case of a primary vaccination, which should have been carried out when the animals were at least 3 months old;
 - b. Not more than one year prior to shipment in the case of a booster vaccination;
 - c. With an inactivated virus vaccine or with a recombinant vaccine expressing the rabies virus glycoprotein;

OR

 - iv. were not been vaccinated against rabies or do not meet all the conditions set out in points ii and iii above; in such cases, the Kenyan authorities may require the placing of the animals in a quarantine station located in the country for up to six months at the cost of the owner of the animal.
3. Is clinically free of symptoms of any other contagious and infectious disease and internal and external parasites, the certificate being dated not more than 48 hours before embarkation;
4. This import permit shall be valid for a maximum of **ninety days** and shall only be for **one consignment**.
5. This import permit shall accompany the animal during importation.
6. Animals entering Kenya should travel as Manifest Cargo and use the Freight Compartment of the aircraft. Arrangements to have the animal travel in the passenger cabin shall be at the discretion of the Veterinary authority who should be notified 12 hours prior to arrival of the animal.
